

Despite years of hostility and prosecution by the United States government, Muhammad Zahid Chaudhry remains a positive, cheerful, generous individual who has dedicated his time and talents to create peace and social justice. We both serve on the Board of Thurston Community Media that provides opportunities for people in our community to have a voice. When my daughters' cars had to have repairs, he loaned them both a car without charge. I wish all U.S. citizens were as compassionate and generous as Zahid!

I urge you to dismiss any proceedings initiated under the provisions of CARRP, or any potential evidence developed through procedures authorized by CARRP.
