My son is in the Washington Air National Guard. Our family volunteered with Civil Air Patrol for several years. Our belief in service to community, State and Nation runs strong.

While volunteering in our community we met Muhammad Zahid Chaudhry. We were very impressed with his devotion and service to others. We later learned he is a decorated disabled U.S. Army veteran who sustained injuries while serving in the US military. These injuries have left him permanently in a wheelchair. In spite of his challenges he continues to be a valued member of our community.



Mr. Chaudhry also qualifies for US citizenship because he is married to a US citizen and has been married for over 16 years. Please consider the importance of family by ruling in favor of citizenship. Mr. and Mrs. Chaudhry are both devoted members of our community and volunteer countless hours in service to others. Our family would be extremely disappointed with any court ruling other than full citizenship, because we would be losing a key asset of our community.


